Greetings from the East

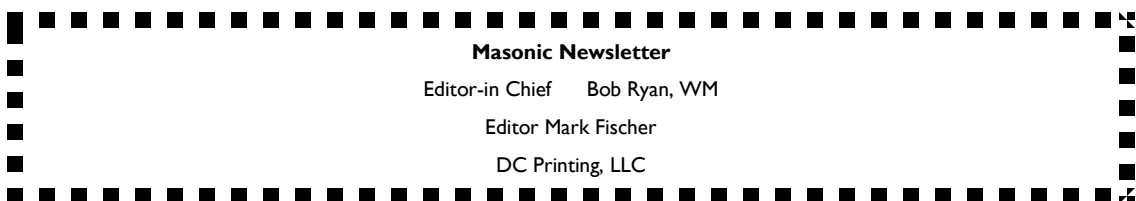
What an unusual winter we had! It seems like spring sprung before it was even spring! Lest we get too used to it, remember we still have to survive April.

The mix of the "polite and lively characteristics of French and the thoughtlessness and improvidence of the Aborigines" created a society "possessing the virtues of hospitality and the warmth of the heart unknown to the residents of cities, untrammelled by the etiquette and conventional rules of modern 'high life', they were ever ready to receive and entertain their friends, and more intent upon the enjoyment of the present than to lay up store or make provision for the future." I sometimes wonder what I might be missing about the present with my own concerns about the future.
