I'm writing this on a Snowy day at the end of March. Very thankful it's two weeks after the Steamboat Dinner as the snow didn't delay any of our Deliveries.







STEAMBOAT DINNER (SBD)

- 1,350 Meals were prepared.
- 1,145 Meals were delivered of which.
 - \circ 1,102 were donated.
 - o 43 were widows of the Lodge and drivers
- 104 Meals were picked up at the drive-thru
 - o 65 presold online
 - o 39 were sold at Drive Thru
- 101 Meals and left-over items were given to Lakeshore CAP for their distribution to their clients.
- Since 1992 (31 years) 11, 909 donated meals have been given to those in need.
- GOALS
 - We exceeded our Challenge Goal of 1050 by 52, a record.
- PARTICIPATION
 - o 51 Lodge and OES members
 - o 40 Drivers from the Community
 - o 43 Non-Masonic Related Business's or Friends purchased DONATED MEAL
 - 10 501c3 Entities in Door and Kewaunee Counties and Green Bay selected 1,102 recipients of DONATED MEAL
 - $\circ\;$ The city of Sturgeon Bay cleared the snow from the Drive-Thru area.
 - o Sturgeon Bay Utilities provided power to the Drive-Thru area.
 - Seth Taylor our neighbor to the south removed all his vehicles to give us more parking room.
 - Purchase of DONATED MEALS
 - 484 (46%) were purchased by Masonic Brothers and Sisters
 - 618 (54%) were purchased by others
