To our editor, brother Mark for his Job-like patience (this message is right before the deadline as many have been this year).


To brother Tom Pinney Jr. for all he does for the lodge and how he can make a master's year go so smoothly.

Area Administrator (AA) Jay Herbst is leading a Masonic Education Program. At our November 8th meeting, each member received a copy of test sheet for the **Masonic Code Correspondence Course**. He then presented the first 35 questions from the course, asked our response, discuss them, and gave us the correct answers. There are a total of 130 True and False questions. He collected the individual test sheets and will give them out at a future meeting as he continues the program. Once the individual sheets are completed he will collect the \$4.50 fee and send them in for correction. If you pass the course you will receive a certificate. Those not attending lodge might want to go to the WI Grand Lodge Website wisc-freemasonry.org. and take the course. The lodge receives credit for any member successfully passing the course. It is an open book test using the WI Code which is available to read or download from the GL website.

The magic show we sponsored at the Third Ave. Playhouse on Sunday October 28th was a great success. Over 200 children and their adult supervisors enjoyed a wonderful time.
