HISTORY;---

- The idea of donating dinners to the needy in Door County **began back in 1992**. We sought the help of Bev. Knutsen and Erin Szalaka from Social Services who partnered with us by identifying those in need of a hot meal.
- We in turn solicited our members to purchase these special Donated Tickets which were then given to Social Services for their distribution, and the recipients joined us in the basement of the lodge for a hot meal. Their identity remained known only to Social Services. Fifty persons received and used these tickets the first year.
- Since 1992, the program has expanded greatly and to date 6,600 Donated Tickets have been provided to those in need in the Community. Although, over 75% of these tickets are purchased by Masons and their friends, the program has evolved beyond the Masonic Family with ever increasing support from the Community. A record 563 Donated Tickets were purchased for the 2017 Steamboat Dinner.
