Editor's Notes

I am honored to share the following letter I received this last month from Mariellen Haen:

Dear Master Mitch,

First of all, I want to thank you (and the lodge) so much for spotlighting organ donation. For those families that have been blessed by an organ transplant, getting information out to the public about donation is very important.

Many people know my story about organ donation because of my husband Tony, and his fight for every breath he took. Tony was a Mason, Scottish Rite, and Beja clown for many years. Through all those years, Tony was true to the Masonic life, in and out of the lodge. His affiliation with the Shrine Clowns gave him opportunities to engage with young and old, bringing joy to all.

Organ donation was brought to my family's attention long before Tony became ill. Over 30 years ago, my brother Doug was in need of a bone marrow transplant. Our family and friends stepped up to be tested and added our names to the organ donation list. This was a wakeup call for our family, experiencing firsthand the life-giving ability we all have through organ donation.

Most families will never go through a loved one needing a donation of a major organ to survive. When we think of organ donation, we should also think of giving the gift of blood. Everyone knows someone that has had a surgery, and having blood available is critical. Many people don't want to talk about organ donation, because they don't want to talk about their death. Blood donation is something the general public can do year after year, saving up to 3 people's lives with each donation. That is your first challenge. Roll up your sleeve, and save 3 lives.

Now, back to the present, and my journey of organ donation for Tony.

When a loved one is so very sick that you don't know if they will have another tomorrow, you cling onto the one thing that never goes away. That is Faith. With Faith comes Hope, and the assurance that we are not alone. My Masonic roots go deep, my father was a Mason, brothers and my son are masons, and I started out as a Jobs Daughter and have continued with Masonic affiliated organizations throughout my life. I thank all of the Masons that have stayed the course and put into practice the lessons taught to them.

This challenge that is in front of you is a very real need. It is being presented to you because if any group can change the world for the better, it is the Masonic family. Thank you for living the code!

On January 27th of 2019 my brother Jay and I were on the other end of the donation process when we were able to donate the organs for our sister Heidi. Three or more people were able to benefit from here gifts. Two people received kidneys and another person received a liver. In addition, other tissues were able to be harvested. Due to the nature of her death and the cornor needing to do an examination, other organ could not be used. We had the opportunity to correspond with a couple of the recipients.
