While strolling down the aisle of vendors at Lifest, I observed a sign with a picture of the Masonic Temple on it. I stopped and met the director coordinating the purchase of the facility. First, she was thankful to Freemasons for engaging in the sale and expressed compassion to the mixed emotions many people may have about change after approximately 40 years in the same location. Secondly, she was quick to comment that after approximately 8 years of searching they felt that they immediately found their home and that God had a plan for Mason's to build and be the steward of a perfect facility for them. After reflecting on this encounter, it reaffirmed to me that Freemasonry isn't about the building we meet in but in the experiences and impacts we can make to our candidates, to our fellow Brothers, our families and our communities. Are you and is your lodge focusing on the right priorities in your programming? We are more than a building!






