On occasion I will write about a Famous Mason and what he contributed to society. This time around I will give some facts about a notable Eastern Star member. Let's see if you

know who this is.

Born on Christmas Day in 1821, this woman was destined to shine the light of hope on the world. Although she obtained a career in teaching for 12 years starting in 1938, her presence was felt during the Civil War where she was part of The Ladies Aid Society, a women's organization who helped distribute medical supplies to field hospitals. She was known as the 'Angel of the Battlefield" for her efforts. She was appointed, under Union General Benjamin Butler, as the lady in charge of the army hospitals at The Army of the James.

After the war, she took a trip to Europe where she went for a vacation. At this time she was introduced to the Red Cross society and superintended the supplies distribution during the Franco-Prussian War. For her efforts, she received Golden Cross of Baden and the Prussian Iron Cross. Upon her return in 1878, she wanted to start a chapter of The International Red Cross in America, and from her efforts the American Red Cross was born. After talking with president Chester Arthur, it was achieved. She figured it did not just be used for war time, but also for relief of natural disasters, i.e. earthquakes, hurricanes and the like. In 1882, the first meeting was held in Dansville, New York

Our cooperative arrangement with the **Boys and Girls Club (BGC)** continues. The lodge voted to donate to the BGC \$500 to be used to purchase winter clothing for members who are in need. Forty plus kids have been so identified. Adequate winter clothing costs an average of \$200 per child. One-half of our donation will be reimbursed by the Hiram's Helpers. This is a GL program that matches up to \$250 when a lodge helps children in the community. It requires NO forms to be filled out, just copies of receipts. A brother donated \$120 to our Charity account, which enabled us to fund the balance. The lodge next year will be purchasing an AED unit for the BGC. The unit costs \$1500. Application has been made to the GL Medical Fund Matching Grants Program for ½ the cost. This fund will match up to \$800. The OES continues to support the BGC in various ways.

Br. Rick Kohn has asked the lodge to discuss the feasibility of starting a **De Molay Chapter**. He has arranged for State representatives to be present at our stated meeting on January 8, 2015 to explain what is involved. Please plan to be present.
