On April 15 Shawano Lodge hosted the district meeting for District 4 of Wisconsin. Brother Mitch Custer and myself attended from HSB #174.

The meeting was opened on the Master Mason Degree. Welcoming comments were given by District Deputy Chris 'Skipper' Young. The Lodge then held a short School of Instruction session purging the Lodge and taking up the pass with the guidance of District Lecturer Brother Moses Adams present to assist the officers if needed. The lodge went informal to introduce members of the Shawano Fire Department and Police Department. They gave an explanation of their duties and services they provide for the community. The department then opened the floor for any questions from those present. We were all grateful these two departments members were willing to take time to share part of their day with us.

District Repersentive for our area and member of HSB #174 Mitch Custer gave a presentation on Executive Training and Lodge Succession. District Repersentive Notes

Brothers,

Now is the time for all good men to come to the aid of their Lodge. In visiting the many lodges in northeast Wisconsin, the one thing I am seeing is a lack of people on the side lines. Your officers would love to see you come to meetings. Even better, become involved in the administration of it. Become an officer even if you have been to the East before. Every lodge that I have visited seems to need new blood and ideas to remain vibrant.

Your District 4 Team is seeing a lot of activity throughout the district. Look for the new District 4 Newsletter in your email soon. We are looking for new ideas of things that lodge could be doing to make them stand out.

From the Grand Lodge level, we like to see that everyone has paid their dues. Remember your lodge has to pay your Per Capita tax the first part of this year. Being in the arrears can cause a burden on your lodge.

The question has come up as to how many of you are reading this Newsletter; let the officers know if you enjoy reading this Newsletter. Write or call us and let us know if there is something you would like to see in the Newsletter. As the editor, I would love to have more input and ideas of what people want to see.

With the Annual Communication coming at the beginning of June, look for the following changes to voted on by your lodge reps. It is proposed that the Per Capita will go to \$50.00 for 2024. The rules for having alcohol in the lodge building may change to allow a more open option. Change the term 'Worshipful' in our titles to 'Worthy' could be made. A change could be made to allow lodges to open in anyone of the three degrees and conduct business. This would be at the Masters discretion. The Perpetual Member plan may well be changes for good. It is their plan to offer the lodges a way to receive monies for all deceased PMP members over a nine-year period. This would replace the lodges from getting the PMP payment on those members that have died into perpetuity. This motion would not change the living PMP members' dues from being paid each year. Another motion would give the Grand Master the power to suspend a member that has been accused of a felony or sexual assault. This is only a suspension until after the crime has been adjudicated. If found guilty of the crime then the member would be expelled from the fraternity permanently. There are a few other motions that may come before the members.
