'Greetings Brothers

A group known as “Adoptive Lodges” was established within the French Rite in the mid – 18th century. The first of these Lodges as far as we know, was established in 1760 in Paris by the Count de Beckville. Another was established at Nimeguen, in Holland, in 1774, over which the Prince of Waldeck and the Princess of Orange presided. There were basically four degrees of Adoptive Masonry: Apprentice (or Female Apprentice); Compagnone (or Crafts Woman); Maitresse (or Mistress); and Parfaite Maconne (or Perfect Mason)."

After the fourth degree the Lodge had a dinner for the Ladies; thus began “Ladies at the Table.”

Henry S. Baird held a “Ladies at the Table” evening on April 16th. There were 36 Ladies and Masons present. Each of the ladies received a red rose and was toasted. Brother Mike, assisted by of Brother Ed prepared a wonderful dinner (including an amazing chocolate dessert!)
