The first thing is to decide if it is something you want to do at the time of your passing. So many are in need of organs and not enough people consider donating their organs and tissue. If you decide to become a donor and you have not already done so just sign your drivers license. You will also want to let your family and friends know of your wishes. You may also want to make sure to have an advance directive as part of your estate papers. Even if you are young and have a family, have this set of papers completed will help your family know your wishes at a very difficult time.

Another thing each of you should consider is if you want to have a Masonic/OES memorial service at the time of you passing. It is something you should make sure you have communicated to you family. For masons there is a form that the secretary of the lodge can give you to be put with your final papers to direct your family as to your wishes. You should also remember to let them know where to find your apron as you should or can be buried or cremated with it on. This is one of the greatest honors a lodge wants to do for you on your passing from the mortal to the immortal world.
