DAY OF LIGHT--- Henry S. Baird #174 Day of Light

- Scheduled for Saturday October 31, 2020 has been <u>CANCELLED</u> by the Most Worshipful Grand Master due to COVID-19 concerns.
- Scheduled for Saturday January 16, 2021 has been <u>CANCELLED</u> after consulting with AA Mitch Custer. Br. Custer was in a meeting of District 4 officers on Tuesday September 22nd and they felt it we be prudent to cancel the January 16th date. WM Ross Chapman agreed.
- Rescheduled for Saturday March 27, 2021.
- Subject to the following--
 - o The GM's suspension is lifted by that time. Determination to be made at least 60 days ahead.
 - o Subject to the GM's Dispensation
- Plan of Action at this point basically remains the same as the original HSB #174 Day of Light
- We have contacted Roosevelt #322, Washington #21 and Home Lodge Lake County Freemasons Lodge #42 regarding the rescheduled dates.
- WE WILL CONTACT ALL PARTICIPANTS TO CONFIRM WHETHER THEY ARE AVAILABLE OR NOT FOR THIER ORIGINAL ASSIGNMENT.

STATED MEETINGS---

- o HSB #174 is scheduled to have a stated meeting on November 12th at 6:30p.
 - The Lodge will open, conduct business, and close in the EA degree.
 - The plan is to have this be our <u>only stated meeting for the rest of the year</u>.
 - The following Protocols will be in place.
 - A Packet of information will be emailed ahead of time
 - The Air Exchange System will be shut off
 - Rods, tools, Sacred Book, door knobs etc. will be sanitized before and after the meeting Sanitizer will be available

- The Registry book will not be used, rather the S/T will call and record the roll
- Temperatures will be taken by "No Touch". If you have a temperature of 99 degrees or above you will not be allowed to enter.
- If you are not feeling well please do not attend.
- Masks will be required
- Social distancing is to be followed.
- Officers will wear their officer's apron, but leave them on their chairs when they leave. Other members please bring your own if possible and take it home with you. If you need to use a white lodge apron please spread it out on one of the seats when you leave.
- Food will **not** be served per the WM.
- The WM has cancelled the December 10, 2020 meeting due to COVID-19 concerns. We normally do not meet on the 4th Thursday of November or December because of Thanksgiving and Christmas. We will keep you informed as to when after the November 12 stated meeting we again will meet in person.

ELECTED OFFICERS FOR 2021

- o All of the Elected 2020 Officers have agreed to continue in their stations for 2021. Trustee Rick Rogers has agreed to serve a second 3-year term.
- o Per the Grand Master we will not need to hold an election or have an installation of officers as all have agreed to stay in their station for 2021. The Master will appoint Rick Rodgers to fill the open trustee position until he can be elected to the position next year and then installed, which the Master do at that time.

HOLIDAY MEAL---This annual event of the Lodge will be on Saturday November 7th.

SALVATION ARMY BELL RINGING---

- HSB & OES will again ring bells for the Salvation Army from 8:00 am to 8 pm on Saturday December 12, 2020 at Econo-Foods.
- Ed Klein (920-737-3166) will be in charge and will be soliciting volunteers during November.

STEAMBOAT DINNER---It is scheduled for March 13, 2021.

- The decision has been made that the Dining Room will not be open to the public.
- The Drive-Thru will be open and we will, as in the past, make Deliveries of donated dinners as needed.
- Several of our large donors already have indicated they will again participate in purchasing donated tickets.
- As of 10/19/20 we have received \$3,380 from 15 donors for 211 Donated Tickets. Our goal is 850 with a challenge of 900! Last year 863 were purchased. Please consider purchasing Donated Tickets to help those in need.

CHARITY---Following is a summary of our 2020 Charity Outreach.

HSB #174 and Wisconsin Masonic Foundation (WMF) checks have been sent totaling \$1,250 to EACH of the following School Districts in Door and Kewaunee County. This totaled \$6,250 for the 5 School Districts

- o Gibraltar
- Sturgeon Bay
- o Sevastopol
- o Southern Door
- o Algoma
- WMF check was mailed for \$1,000 to EACH of the following 501(c)3 Community entities in honor of Forest Lodge #130 Wausau
 - o Kewaunee County Food Pantry-Algoma
 - o Feed and Clothe My People Door County
- We notified Forest Lodge #130 that HSB #174 had been able to parlay the \$500 as the winner of their Organ Donor contest into a total of \$3,000 which was donated in honor of Forest #130 lodge as follows
 - o \$1,000 to the Grandmaster's appeal --- Feeding Wisconsin
 - o \$1,000 to Kewaunee County Food Pantry-Algoma (see above)
 - o \$1,000 to Feed and Clothe My People Door County (see above)

These grants totaling \$9,250 were funded by

- \$2,250 Matching funds from WMF
- \$500 from Forest Lodge #130 Contest
- \$6,500 from HSB Funds
 - o \$1,500 from our budgeted charity
 - o \$5,000 from the Denis and June Bay legacy
 - The brothers of the lodge felt we needed to share this generous \$50,000 legacy, so they voted to increase our 2020 charity budget by \$5,000 representing a tithe of the Denis and June Bay legacy.
 - Our lodge has been blessed during this COVID 19 pandemic and our brothers allowed their minds to listen to the needs of others and their hearts to act with Friendship, Morality, and Brotherly love with the knowledge and understanding that all Wisdom comes from the Grand Architect of the Universe.

- Grand Lodges 2-year Assessment of \$10 per year, for Wisconsin Masonic Center (formerly Madison Masonic Center)
 - o 2020 was \$10. Primary members were responsible for paying this to the Grand Lodge. Twenty-Three (23) of our Primary members did not pay this assessment to Grand Lodge has been sent us an invoice for \$230 which HS Baird #174 has paid. Primary members who did not pay will see this \$10 assessment on their 2021 dues notices as a Grand Lodge assessment for 2020.

UPDATE GRAND LODGE COVID-19 EDICT---

- The Grand Master has issued a protocol to **allowing food** to be served at meetings.
- The **Grand Master**, has announced a plan to allow lodges to do EA degrees. This is subject to the following;
 - o Before conducting your **EA degree**, we must get approval from the DDGM.
 - o Either an AA, DL or DDGM must be present at our EA Degree, meaning you need to provide DDGM the date & time of the degree when you call him for permission to conduct our EA.
 - No one will touch the Holy Writings during a degree except the candidate and the SD if the SD needs to readjust the S&C. You will not flip pages for the candidate to kiss the Holy Writings (consider a "virtual" kiss). The SD can of course, conduct his regular duties at opening and closing.
 - Nitrile (exam, non-latex) gloves will be worn by candidates and degree team members. I
 would recommend white or clear colored glove. Consider wearing white cotton washable gloves
 over the Nitrile gloves for a better look.
- However, The Officers of HSB #174 have decided not to put on any EA Degrees until the COVID -19 numbers have significantly come down. We will keep you posted.
