Resolution No_1 - 2019____

The purpose of this Resolution is to change the wording in the Wisconsin Floor Work and Instructions (Red Book) to align with the change made at the 49th Triennial Assembly in Orlando FL regarding wearing hats and gloves in the Chapter room.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following revision be made to the Wisconsin Floor Work and Instructions (Red Book), page 15, #14 **which now reads**:

14. Hats and gloves are not permitted to be worn in the Chapter room.

Be changed to read:

14. Hats and gloves are not permitted to be worn in the Chapter room, <u>except for medical</u> <u>or religious reasons</u>.

AND BE IT RESOLVED that the following revision be made to the Wisconsin Floor Work and Instructions (Red Book), page 141, #2, **which now reads**:

2. The Associate Conductress should memorize her lecture. She should also see that the candidates do not enter the Chapter room wearing gloves, hats, coats, or carrying purses.

Be changed to read:

2. The Associate Conductress should memorize her lecture. She should also see that the candidates do not enter the Chapter room wearing <u>hats or gloves, except for medical or religious reasons</u>, coats, or carrying purses.

AND BE IT RESOLVED that the following revision be made to the Wisconsin Floor Work and Instructions (Red Book), page 196, #4 **which now reads**:

4. White covers for the Rituals may be used. Choir robes lend dignity to the ceremony but it is not necessary. Hats, gloves and formals should not be worn by officers taking part in the ceremony. Soft music may be provided.

Be changed to read:

4. White covers for the Rituals may be used. Choir robes lend dignity to the ceremony but it is not necessary. <u>Hats and gloves, except for medical or religious reasons</u>, and formals should not be worn by officers taking part in the ceremony. Soft music may be provided.

Rationale:

The Ritual (page 50) states hats and gloves can be worn for medical reasons. A resolution was adopted at the 49th Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Chapter (GGC) in October 2018 to add religious reasons. The Ritual indicates a person with a belief in a "Supreme Being", with the requisite Masonic Relationship, can be a member of our Order. Given that we have non-Christian members in our Order, we need to be sensitive to the religious requirements they may have. Our Code indicates when a Ritual change is made by the GGC it shall immediately be in force in Wisconsin without need of a resolution to have it accepted into our Code of Laws, but we need a resolution to have it updated in our Red Book.

Wisconsin Code of Laws, Title XXIV Rules of Order for Subordinate Chapters, Paragraph 49, Rule #10 Members shall remove gloves and hats before entering the Chapter Room except for medical or religious reasons.

Code Changes Required Passage by GGC adopted resolutions Red Book Changes required for passage – Majority

Resolution No 2 – 2019

The purpose of this Resolution is to address who is eligible to present and retire the Flag.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following revision be made to the Wisconsin Order of Eastern Star Floor Work and Instructions, page 61, #3 which now reads:

The Associate Patron will act as Standard Bearer, Conductress and Associate Conductress as the Guard of Honor. If the Associate Patron is not present, any member may be appointed to act as Standard Bearer.

Be changed to read:

The Associate Patron will act as Standard Bearer, Conductress and Associate Conductress as the Guard of Honor. If the Associate Patron is not present **or physically unable to carry the flag**, any member may be appointed to act as Standard Bearer.

Rationale:

In the last few years we have been instructing members that anyone can present the Flag if the AP is not present or if he is not able to. To be consistent in our verbal instructions, it should be included as instruction in the Red Book.

Resolution No_3 - 2019

The purpose of this Resolution is to change the manner in which the Star Points hand out the colored ribbons of her station and the procedure she should take while explaining the colors.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following revision be made to the Wisconsin Order of Eastern Star Floor Work and Instructions, page 154 #41 2nd paragraph which now reads:

STAR POINT: (Ritual)

After the word (Blue, Yellow, White, Green or Red), she steps forward to give the ribbon to each new member and then continues speaking. Adah, Ruth and Esther start with the new member closest to the Altar and work south; Martha and Electa start with the new member closest to the Altar and work north. The Star Point will remain with the last new member until she finishes the explanation of the color.

Be changed to read:

After the word (Blue, Yellow, White, Green or Red), she steps forward to give the ribbon to each new member. Adah, Ruth and Esther start with the new member closest to the Altar and work south; Martha and Electa start with the new member closest to the Altar and work north. After the Ribbons are presented, the Star Point will then back to the side of her chair and continue speaking by giving the explanation of the color.

Rationale:

By presenting the ribbons to the new members without speaking, then explaining the meaning of the color while at the side of her chair, the Star Point is able to address the new members collectively rather than speaking only to the last new member to receive the ribbon. From the side of the chair, she can make eye contact with all of the new members while giving the explanation of the color.

The purpose of this Resolution is to change the wording for the Prayer circle in the Wisconsin Floor Work and Instructions (Red Book) to clarify who does not join the Prayer circle.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following revision be made to the Wisconsin Floor Work and Instructions (Red Book), page 157, #49 (2) **which now reads**:

49. (2) All officers, with the exception of the Conductresses, new members, Worthy Patron and Warder, move immediately as per line of march in the Diagram of the Labyrinth. (Worthy Patron and Warder do not leave their stations.)

Be changed to read:

49. (2) All officers, with the exception of the Conductresses, new members, Worthy Patron, <u>Organist</u>, Warder and <u>Sentinel</u>, move immediately as per line of march in the Diagram of the Labyrinth. (Worthy Patron, <u>Organist</u>, Warder and <u>Sentinel</u> do not leave their stations.)

Resolution No_5- 2019___

The purpose of this Resolution is to change the wording to make the Wisconsin Floor Work and Book of Instruction (Red Book) consistent with the Ritual of the Order of Eastern Star.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following revision be made to the Wisconsin Order of Eastern Star Floor Work and Instructions, page 39, #3 and page 57 Closing the Bible and Prayer, Page 58-59, #7 **now reads**:

(Page 39) 3. During Closing Ceremonies

(Page 57) Closing the Bible and Prayer

#1. The same directions are to be observed by the Chaplain and Conductress in the performance of their duties in the closing ceremonies as stated in the opening ceremonies. Refer to Ritual (Closing the Chapter).

(Page 58-59) #7. As the Conductress reaches this position, ALL OFFICERS AND MEMBERS including the Worthy Patron drop their hands to their sides and ALL, except the Chaplain and Conductress who remain facing the Altar, turn to face east to direct their attention to the Worthy Matron during the remainder of the Closing Ceremony. All remain in this position until the Chapter is declared closed and the Worthy Matron has completed her orders to the Warder.

Be changed to read:

Order of the Eastern Star Floor Work and Instruction (Red Book)

#3. During Closing of the Chapter

Closing the Bible and Prayer

#1. The same directions are to be observed by the Chaplain and Conductress in the performance of their duties in the closing of the Chapter as stated in the opening ceremonies. Refer to Ritual (Closing the Chapter).

(Page 58-59) #7. As the Conductress reaches this position, ALL OFFICERS AND MEMBERS including the Worthy Patron drop their hands to their sides and ALL, except the Chaplain and Conductress who remain facing the Altar, turn to face east to direct their attention to the Worthy Matron during the remainder of the Closing of the Chapter. All remain in this position until the Chapter is declared closed and the Worthy Matron has completed her orders to the Warder.

Rationale:

The Ritual of the Order of the Eastern Star does not say that the closing is considered a ceremony. Only the opening is considered a ceremony, therefore our Red Book of Instruction should not call it a ceremony in the three instances above. It should just be the "closing of the Chapter".

The Wisconsin Code of Laws, Article II, Order of Business, Section 1. #19. Closing Ceremonies Changed to Closing of the Chapter.
