Eastern Star Training Awards for Religious Leadership has been a permanent charity of the General Grand Chapter for over 60 years. We need your help to continue its effectiveness. The purpose of ESTARL is to provide monetary funds to help individuals who are preparing for religious service.

First, we need to ask members to find us candidates who are preparing for the ministry, chaplaincy, church music, etc. and who have been accepted by an accredited college, university or seminary. A short-term application is also available for laity attending workshops or classes to enhance their leadership role within their church. As a Chapter you have the opportunity to recommend persons to receive financial assistance. If a worthy candidate comes to mind, please provide them with our ESTARL brochure and scholarship application. Both are available on-line on our Grand Chapter website. After the candidate completes their application, no later than May 1st, a vote of their sponsoring chapter is required along with the Chapter seal. Once approved by the Chapter, the application should be sent to the Grand Secretary, 36275 Sunset Drive Dousman, WI 53118 by June 15th.

Secondly, we need <u>your financial support</u>. These scholarships are available due solely to your generosity. Education is so expensive that for many it would not be possible without assistance. As you busily prepare for Christmas, we ask that you individually and/or your Chapter consider giving a generous donation to help us continue with this important charity. RED BOOK HINTS

In the Red Book, Preliminaries, page 14 #12, it states that all Chapters will open in short form no more than three times a year. What is long form or short form? Long form or short form refers to the charges of the officers in the opening ceremony. In the ritual the bracketed sections of the duty and badge may be omitted for short form and Chapters may use short form three times a year at a stated meeting. All other stated meetings are to be opened in long form, with the officers giving their duty and explanation of their badge. The Secretary needs to write in the minutes if the meeting was opened in long form or short form; there is no such thing as "regular form." Special meetings may be opened in short form and do not count towards your maximum use of three short form openings.

IN MEMORIAM Nicholas (Nick) W. Schultz

Once again, our Golden Chain has been broken with the passing of Past Grand Patron, Brother Nicholas (Nick) Schultz. Brother Nick and his beloved wife, PGM Sister Doris Schultz, were in Stevens Point to attend the party for the Grand Officers of the Soaring Amongst the Stars Grand Family when he passed away very unexpectedly on October 21, 2018, one day before his 75th birthday.

Nick was born on October 22, 1943 in Milwaukee. He was united in marriage to Doris Sprecher on June 9, 1973 at Blackhawk UMC in Blackhawk, WI.

Nick graduated from the University of Wisconsin in Madison with a Master of Business (MBA) and went on to work at the University in Madison in the Accounting Department as an auditor. In 1986 he moved to Milwaukee where he took a position at UW-Milwaukee Campus as Assistant Dean in the graduate program in charge of grants and funding until his retirement. Being the active fellow he was, he took a 20 hour a week job at the Piggly Wiggly Store in Cedarburg, bagging groceries. He thoroughly enjoyed every minute of meeting and chatting with people.

Nick gave much of his life to Masonry and various organizations within the Fraternity. He was an active member and Past Master of Ozaukee Masonic Lodge #17 as well as the Ozaukee Chapter Order of the Eastern Star #147 in Port Washington. He was also a member and Past Patron of Starlight Chapter in Madison. Nick was appointed Grand Sentinel by PGM Phyllis Eklov and PGP Harley Bennett in the "Precious Memories" Grand Family. Like Brother Harley stated, "When Sister Phyllis and I were choosing Grand Officers, you were the first one who came to mind and you haven't disappointed us a bit." That was so true; he was installed as Worthy Grand Patron with Sister Karen Stauffer, Worthy Grand Matron, in the "Garden of Knowledge" Grand Family. Their watchwords were Hug and Kisses: Harmony Unites Generations and Kinship is Something Special in Eastern Star. His Bible Verse was: The mustard seed is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of trees: Matthew 13:32. Nick served the Grand Chapter of Wisconsin on so many committees, as well as General Grand Chapter on the International Peace Garden Committee.

Nick was a member of Cedarburg Community United Methodist Church. He was a member of The American Legion Post #288, belonged to Tripoli Shrine, where he was a member of the Highlanders Bagpipers. Nick enjoyed playing Uncle Sam at the Ozaukee County Fair; many will remember him as their Uncle Sam.

Nick is survived by his wife Doris, his children, Alyson and Nicole Schultz; and grandson, Kegan White. He is further survived by his two brothers, one sister and other relatives and friends.

A Celebration of life was held at 1 p.m. on Thursday, Nov. 1, 2018, at Eernisse Funeral Home in Cedarburg, WI. Visitation was held at the funeral home from noon until the time of service. Nick will be laid to rest at Sunset Memory Gardens in Madison, Wis.

In lieu of flowers, memorials were asked to be directed to the Order of the Eastern Star Heart Fund (Grand Secretary OES, 36275 Sunset Dr., Dousman, WI 53118-9349.

Personal Note: We are thankful, Brother Nick, for your well-spent life, what you gave to our beautiful Order and the many "Precious Memories" your sisters and brothers from the Precious Memories Grand Family were happy to share with you.

We request that this Memorial be read at the first Stated Meeting and the Charter be draped for a period of thirty days in memory of our dearly departed Brother.
