Dear Sisters and Brothers:

On September 17 we sent out the following announcement. "All events scheduled for October are cancelled. Chapters cannot hold in person meetings or events until further notice. Events are any time Eastern Star members gather for any Eastern Star reason i.e. fund raising or social at any location. In October we will let you know the status for November and December."

In the last 3 weeks the numbers in Wisconsin have continued to climb. The Governor has just issued an order that may help bring the numbers down. Nobody knows what will happen in the immediate future. We are cancelling all meetings and events for November and December. You may make your Holiday plans without worrying if an Eastern Star meeting will interfere with them. Wisconsin Eastern Star Foundation

Have you found yourself facing financial hardship? Do you know of a member of your Chapter who could use some financial assistance? There are many reasons why someone may need a helping hand. As Wisconsin Eastern Star members, we are fortunate to have the Wisconsin Eastern Star Foundation. The Foundation is one of the means through which we accomplish the great beneficent purpose of providing for the welfare of our Sisters and Brothers. The Foundation is a separate entity from Grand Chapter; the business of the Foundation lies solely with the Board of Directors. The Foundation meets quarterly to review applications and provide aid to Sisters and Brothers of Wisconsin Applications are confidential and Chapters. only reviewed by the members of the Foundation Board.

The Foundation Board will be meeting in December. Applications for financial assistance can be submitted at any time but need to be received at the Grand Chapter Office no later than Thursday December 10th for consideration this quarter. Applications can be received from your Chapter Secretary, the Grand Secretary or downloaded on the Wisconsin OES website (wioes.org, under the Forms tab).

Grand Officer Nominations

At Grand Chapter in May 2019 a motion was made and passed that nominations for Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Associate Grand Conductress and one Grand Trustee for a three-year term are to be submitted to the Grand Chapter Office to the Grand Secretary no later than February 1st of the election year so nomination information may be sent to Chapters in March. Only the nominee's Name, Chapter, Chapter number, City, and their qualifications for office are to be mentioned. This does not prevent a nomination to be done the day of elections at Grand Chapter.

With the cancellation of Grand Chapter 2020, the Worthy Grand Matron has determined the nominations for two elected Grand Officer candidates published in the February 2020 newsletter do not need to be resubmitted for consideration at the 2021 Grand Chapter session. Additional nominations are to be received by the Grand Secretary no later than February 1, 2021. Please refer to the clarification by WGM Laramie Reissner to the motion that was published in the December 2019 newsletter.

Here are fun facts about Thanksgiving to share around the dinner table.

- The first Thanksgiving was celebrated in 1621 over a three day harvest festival. It included 50 Pilgrims, 90 Wampanoag Indians, and lasted three days. It is believed by historians that only five women were present.
- Turkey wasn't on the menu at the first Thanksgiving. Venison, duck, goose, oysters, lobster, eel, and fish were likely served, alongside pumpkins and cranberries (but not pumpkin pie or cranberry sauce!).
- Abraham Lincoln proclaimed Thanksgiving a national holiday on October 3, 1863. Sarah Josepha Hale, the woman who wrote "Mary Had A Little Lamb," convinced Lincoln to make Thanksgiving a national holiday after writing letters for 17 years.

- The average number of calories consumed on Thanksgiving is 4,500.
- Butterball answers more than 100,000 turkey-cooking questions via their Butterball Turkey Hotline each November and December.
- The tradition of football on Thanksgiving began in 1876 with a game between Yale and Princeton. The first NFL games were played on Thanksgiving in 1920.
