On a personal note, this past Friday Masonry and Star lost one of its great members. Brother Fred Leidel age 102 passed. He had served as Master in two lodged in Madison, the first back in 1955 in the other in 1995, I think. He served as Worthy Patron at Starlite Chapter countless times and was Patron in 1986 with my mother as Matron in the year I was Master at Doric. At this time, he was also on the arrangements committee for Grand Chapter. I believe he had also served on other committees for Eastern Star. Fred was always ready to lend a hand when either group needed a hand. He cooked pancakes for our monthly pancake breakfast that helped the lodge and star pay off the building. He and his wife, Marge, always made the baked beans for our annual chicken dinner in August. If a part was needed in a degree, Fred was always ready. He always knew his part. He made if fun to be a part of either organization. He had also been the oldest volunteer at EAA up until he fell and broke his back at the age of 99. That did not stop him though from riding his three-wheel bike to the local public school to help kids learn to read and do their homework. He became known as Grampa Fred and continued to find a way to get to the school even in the winter. He is the true meaning of a great Masonic/Star example. His life may have ended but the examples he left live on in the things he showed others.
