Greetings from the East,

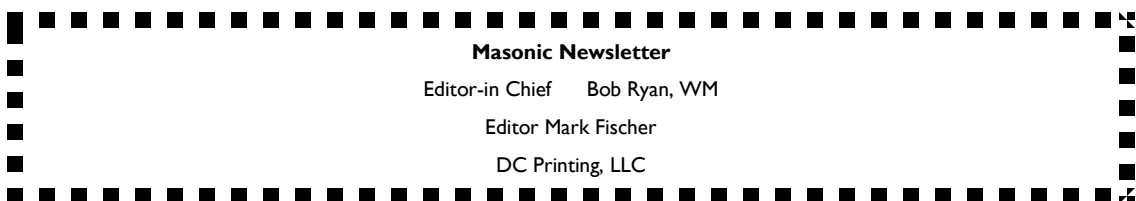
