- More **replacement furniture for the Foyer and Preparation Room** has appeared thanks to T.J. and Andy Buechner at little or no cost to the Lodge.


WATER LEAK FINAL REPAIR

Editor's Notes

Updates from District 4: Day of Light at Shawano on Saturday September 10th, starts at 7:00 am. Until about 5:30 pm.

Casual dinner and drinks to follow, RSVP by September 6 if planning to attend. Dinner will be offsite and will be family style chicken dinner. Cost is \$13.00.

District 4 Meeting will be on Saturday September 24th at Marinette Lodge. Agenda to be sent to lodge secretaries and masters. We will start at 9:00 am, may have coffee and rolls beforehand.

One of the ways we know each other outside of lodge is to say, "I see you are a traveling man". I just got back from a trip to Alaska, where I attended a meeting of the most northern lodge in Alaska at Fairbanks. It was very interesting to attend lodge in a different state. Most of the opening and closing were the same, there were a few differences. The Secretary was also a member of the lodge at North Pole, yes there is a North Pole in Alaska. The Secretary had a full white beard. While in Skagway we came upon the oldest masonic lodge in Alaska. I did not attend there as they did not list when their

meeting was. Along the way I met several masons from all over the country. I was wearing my masonic hat, and, in each case, I heard the comment, I see you are a traveling man.

I have bumper strips of the Grand Masters emblem; I hope each of you will display it as you will meet other masons during your travels. This is the reason for the Grand Masters emblem - to promote your being proud of being a Wisconsin Free Mason.

Another episode of my travels was to attend a Master Mason degree at Oshkosh lodge during the EAA convention. I met many masons from Wisconsin plus two gentlemen from England who had come to EAA just to attend lodge here in Wisconsin. They donated a necktie from their home lodge and one of their aprons from their lodge also. I also had the pleasure to meet the son of Gary Powers (U2 pilot shot down over Russia in the 60's).

It is our hope here at the Grand Lodge that you will feel more encouraged to travel to other lodges. It is way to see masonry in a different light. Each lodge has its own atmosphere and feel. It is fun to meet other brothers in their own lodge environment.

If you have friends or relatives who want to become a mason, look to the upcoming Days of Light. The first one is in Shawano on the 10th of September. There will be another one put on by Beja Shrine on November 12th, details to be forthcoming.
