As I write this many thoughts come to my mind about the past busy summer.

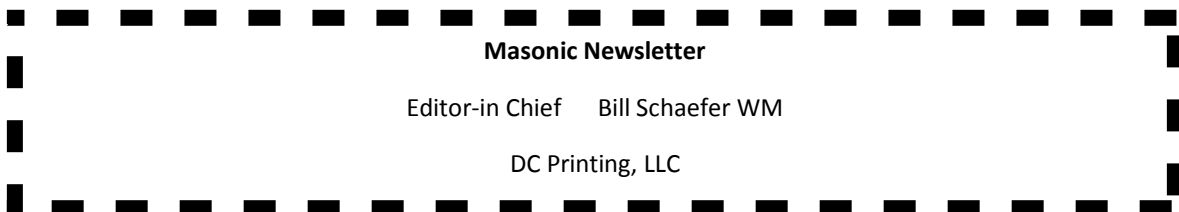
